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RESEARCH UPDATES Global Influential Leader Award for ISB alumnus

Don Mohanlal, a PGPMAX Class of 2012 alumnus, figures in the list of 100 Pioneers and Change Agents recognised by AACSB which announced its inaugural Global Influential Leaders Award today.

Mohanlal is in the august company of Walmart Founder Sam Walton, former U.S. Secretary of State Colin Powell, Deloitte Global CEO Punit Renjen, Citi Bank CEO Mark Mason, LEGO Group President & CEO Jørgen Vig Knudstorp, and several other eminent leaders for making an impact in the world through their business acumen, leadership, or entrepreneurial success.

This award has been instituted by <u>AACSB International</u> (AACSB), the premier global accrediting body and membership association for the world's leading business schools. Mohanlal's work exemplifies the innovative mindset and meaningful contributions to society that ISB graduates display around the world and every day - whether they operate within large corporations, small businesses, or the nonprofit sector.

Mohanlal graduated from the ISB's Post Graduate Programme in Management for Senior Executives, PGPMAX in 2012. Currently he serves as the Executive Director, Innovation and Impact, at the National 4-H Council, USA. Additionally, Mohanlal is Vice Chairman at the Nand & Jeet Khemka Foundation, a philanthropic entity of the Khemka Family, dedicated to making a substantial impact on the reduction of poverty, with a deep commitment to innovative collaborative and partnership approaches in the areas of integrated rural development, climate change, social entrepreneurship and school-based leadership development with values.

Mohanial joins individuals such as the CEO of one of the world's largest global relief services, a technology pioneer who is working to cure cancer, the founder of a global e-commerce powerhouse, and an enterprising president, attributed with reviving an international toy industry favorite. More than 20 industry sectors, from consumer products to healthcare to nonprofits, across 21 countries, <u>are present in this year's group</u>.

"ISB alumni are our brand ambassadors and standard bearers. It is naturally a proud moment for all of us at ISB as they get global recognition across various fields. ISB's PGPMAX alumni have been demonstrating an excellent record of attaining leadership positions and entrepreneurial success. From the nominations, a selection committee reviewed and chose stories that showed a sampling of the positive impact that business school graduates have made on society.
